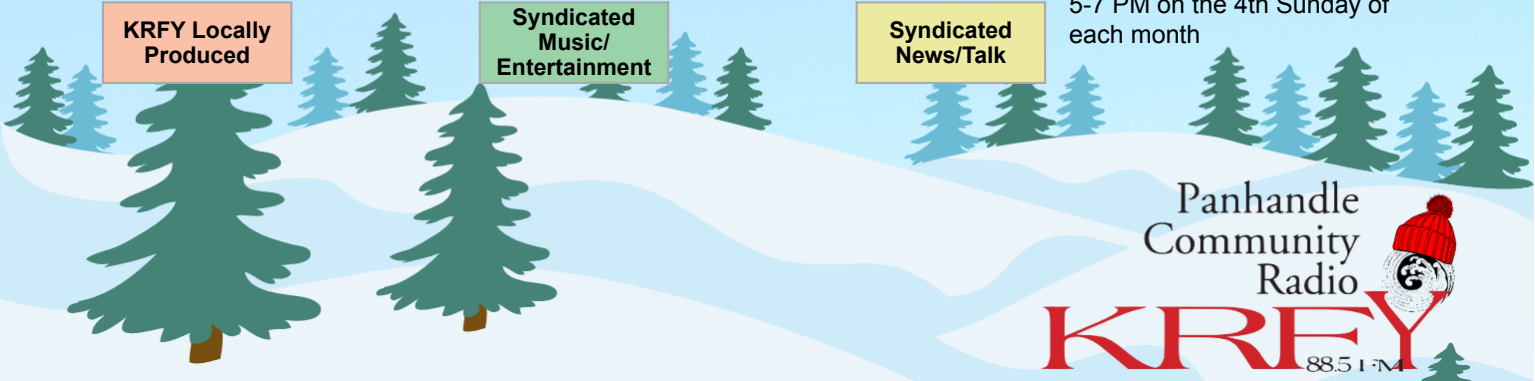

- *Medical Musings with Dr. JoAnn*: Medical news and advice, monthly on the first Monday of the month at 8AM, with a rebroadcast on the third Monday. With retired pediatrician JoAnn Rohyans.
- *The Community Character Hour*: Local History, monthly on the fourth Monday of the month at 8AM and rebroadcast on the second Monday. Hosted by the Bonner County Historical Society and Museum's Executive Director Hannah Combs and the City of Sandpoint's Arts and Historic Preservation Planner Heather Upton.
- *Inland Island*: Reggae music with James Benoit, weekly at 8PM.
- *The Beast and the Priest*: Heavy Metal, especially Judas Priest and Iron Maiden. Weekly at 9PM. Hosted by Terry Nobody.

TUESDAY:

- *The KRFY Morning Show*: with an emphasis on outdoor pursuits and the environment. Hosted by Phil Hough and Julie Kallemeyn. 8AM.
- *Garden Life*: discussing local horticulture and planting on the first Tuesday of the month, with Julie Kallemeyn and Julie Perchynski. 8AM monthly.
- *The Little Live Radio Hour*: Monthly at 8PM on Tuesdays. Live music/variety show from the Little Panida Theater, co-produced with the Festival at Sandpoint.

WEDNESDAY:

- *Easy on a Wednesday Morning*: acoustic and easy listening tunes. With Bernie Moser. 5-7AM.
- *The KRFY Morning Show*: with an emphasis on civic issues and local government. Hosted by Chris Bessler and Suzy Prez. 8AM.
- *The Hump Day Cafe*: Eclectic, new and under-played music from many genres, with Velma, Queen of Fun (alias Gail Fendley). 6-9 PM weekly.
- *Tributes*: Linda Marek presents a new genre or theme of popular music each week. 9PM.

THURSDAY:

- *The KRFY Morning Show*: with an emphasis on arts, culture and entertainment. Hosted by Jim Healey and Jack Peterson. 8AM.
- *CP@3*: An hour of music and discussion of youth and education topics hosted by student reporters from Sandpoint High School's student newspaper, the *Cedar Post*. 3PM.
- *The Folk Show*: Folk music hosted and curated by Jim Healey. 9 PM.

FRIDAY:

- *North Idaho News of the Week*: a half hour with local journalists breaking down the week's events in our area. 8AM.
- *The Blues Hour*: Blues and R&B hosted by Bob Aldrich. 8PM.

SATURDAY:

- *50s Fun and 60s Sounds*: part of KRFY's evening of music through the decades. Bob Hawn hosts, playing his choices and audience requests of music from the 1950s at 5PM and the 1960s at 6PM. The theme continues with 70s at 7 hosted (remotely) by Mike Meissner, and 80s at 8.

SUNDAY:

- *Gospel Music Mix*: hosted by Jason Cooper. 7-9AM.
- *Jazz Over Sandpoint*: Classic Jazz selections with host John Rohyans.
- *4th Sunday Showtime*: A full Broadway musical, narrated live by Don Childress, on the fourth Sunday of the month. 5-7 PM Monthly.

NATIONALLY SYNDICATED PROGRAMS

ALTERNATIVE RADIO - A public affairs program that provides alternative analysis and views of the news.

BETWEEN THE LINES - A weekly, half-hour news magazine featuring progressive perspectives on national and international political, economic, and social issues.

BIG PICTURE SCIENCE - A program that connects ideas about the origins, the behavior, and the future of life and technology on earth in surprising and playful ways.

BIONEERS - A look at current environmental issues.

BOOKWAVES - Produced in Berkeley, California, this half-hour program is about books and their authors.

BUILDING BRIDGES - Radio from the grassroots, a weekly news magazine from community stations across the country.

THE CHILDREN'S HOUR - Produced by adults in collaboration with the "Kids Crew", featuring young musicians, storytellers, and scientific experts of all ages.

CLASSICS & BEYOND - Host Jake Longwell offers a fresh new look at classical music from early to the latest classical compositions.

THE DEAD OF NIGHT - Host Susan Balter-Reitz brings her own take on the incomparable Grateful Dead with music and commentary.

DEMOCRACY NOW! - Weekday morning news with Amy Goodman.

ECONOMIC UPDATE - A weekly show about personal and global economy.

EXPLORATIONS - Physics Professor Michio Kaku with comprehensive up-to-date science news about the rapidly changing world of science.

FOOTLIGHT PARADE - Host Bill Rudman's weekly program showcasing the best of Broadway and Hollywood.

GRATEFUL DEAD HOUR - Sit back, relax, and enjoy an hour of Dead music from David Gans, one of the nation's leading authorities on the Grateful Dead.

THE JAZZ SCENE - Host Jake Longwell offers listeners an eclectic mix of contemporary and traditional jazz, new-age, fusion, and world music.

JUKE IN THE BACK - Between 1946 and 1954, rhythm and blues laid the tracks for what was to become "rock and roll." Matt the Cat will share the records that you couldn't hear on the jukebox in the front of the establishment.

LAKE AIR - A mix of contemporary jazz, new age, and acoustic music just right for relaxing with host Jake Longwell.

LE SHOW - Host Harry Shearer brings wildly clever, iconoclastic stew of talk, music, and political commentary, readings of inadvertently funny public documents or trade magazines and scripted skits.

LETTERS AND POLITICS - Host Mitch Jeserich looks at burning political issues and debates, and their historical context within the United States and worldwide.

LIVE FROM THE DIVIDE - Originating from Bozeman, Montana, a "live" celebration of the American songwriters, both local and regional.

MAKING CONTACT - Magazine/documentary-style public affairs program produced by National Radio Project.

MOP TOPS AND THE KING - An independent, one hour show featuring the music of The Beatles & Elvis Presley with some fun surprises.

SONGS-VOICES-POEMS - Songwriter Jackie Henrion shares her perspectives while playing songs, poetry, writing tips and community writings submitted to the Facebook group, "Songs-Voices-Poems"

SPROUTS - A weekly half-hour program that features radio productions from community radio stations and local media groups across the country.

SOUNDS FROM THE GLOBAL VILLAGE - Host Jake Longwell brings traditional, folkloric, and contemporary music, including field recordings from the early twentieth century to the latest fusion of music and culture from around the world.

TALK NATION RADIO - Progressive news and analysis.

THE TREATMENT - In Hollywood, a "treatment" is a concise overview of a screenplay. Film critic Elvis Mitchell turns the tables and gives the "treatment" to some of the most influential and innovative forces creating movies, art, and entertainment.

WINGS - News program from WINGS: Women's International News Gathering Service.

WOODSONGS OLD-TIME RADIO HOUR - A live audience celebration of grassroots music and the artists who make it.

WOODWARBLER'S JAZZGRASS RADIO - Explores the sonic continuum between traditional bluegrass and all that jazz connotes.
